WEST SIDE [1-5 MEDWAY PLACE]



Nos 1-5 Church Villas were built for ALBERT BAKER NORMAN (1851-1932). By his will of 18 Nov 1919 he left them to his wife Elizabeth, then to pass to his son Edgar Baker Norman and then to Edgar's three children.
