Walter Henry Rumble was baptised in Marlborough, Wiltshire, on 31 May 1835 and had married Anne Pierce, a young widow, at St John's church, Paddington, on 24 November 1855. Walter described himself as a 'Certificated Schoolmaster' on the marriage certificate, so he had no doubt been trained first as a Pupil Teacher before successfully passing an exam to gain his certificate. Since Walter was only 21 when he came to Snodland to teach at the National School in Brook Street, he can hardly have had much teaching experience before then; the Paddington marriage suggests this could have been in London.

Rumble retired from teaching at Easter 1866, but remained in Snodland because he had been appointed as Assistant Overseer, to collect the land tax, income tax and rates. He received great acclaim as a story teller at village entertainments. In February 1873, for instance, at one of the series of 'Penny Readings', the newspaper reported that "'Jonas Grubb's Courtship,' a Wiltshire tale, in the hands of Mr. Rumble left nothing to be desired; the lingo he introduced being given with great humour. In this style of piece Mr. Rumble is unrivalled, nor does he ever fail to raise a hearty laugh from all'. Unfortunately, within a few years he had blotted his copybook. In 1880, having played his part in the Easter entertainments as usual, he absconded with the money, leaving a deficit in the parish accounts of £270. 15s. 11d. Yet his wife and son continued to run the Post Office for many years after. Anne died on 20 July 1887, aged 62 and was buried at All Saints four days later. By 1897 the son Walter and his family had moved to London, where he continued to run a stationery business. He died on 18 February 1930, at a house near Regent's Park, leaving an estate valued at £1042.

TOM HILDER took over as headmaster at the National School from Rumble. In turn he became Rumble's successor as Overseer in 1882 and faithfully served the parish in many capacities until his own death in 1927



This photograph dates from before 1906. William Ashbee lived at various houses in May Street and in 1901 listed himself as gas stoker and newsagent. The shop heading has 'Confectioner Newsagent & Tobacconist', but the newspaper placards are illegible. There is a later photograph taken when William Dunbar had the shop. The separate entrance on the left gave access to the house above for the Rumble and Hilder families.

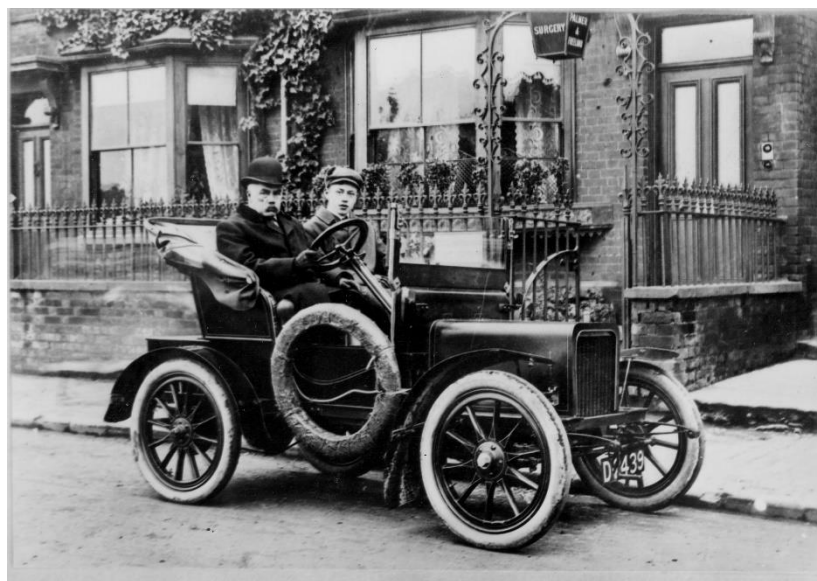

WILLIAM KINGSNORTH (1802-1883) was landlord of the Red Lion 1851 where he was succeeded by his cousin Richard Antrum (1817-1873). He purchased the field next to the paper mill from the mill owners in 1847 and built 16 houses in Mill Street (west side), two terraces of five cottages in the High Street called Railway Place and Railway Terrace and a retirement home which he called Meadow Villa. Memorial in AS churchyard: In loving memory / of / WILLIAM KINGSNORTH / of this parish / died 5th Novr 1883 Aged 81 / *Lord have mercy upon us* / Also SARAH, wife of the above, / died 21st June 1884 aged 69 years. Railway Terrace and Meadow Villa were demolished. The latter was

replaced by 6 cottages in Mill Lane.

At the mill fire on 12 August 1906, the 'Dining Rooms' of Dartnell or Leaver are at the extreme right. However, the census lists mostly place Dartnell at the second house from the right end, which is confusing. Beyond the railway is the group of five houses called **RAILWAY TERRACE**, demolished in the mid-20th century.
