The original name was MILLSWOOD, taken from that of the Hook's house when they were in Gloucestershire, but census returns use many variants. They were built for the mill clerk and mill foreman by Joseph Privett, who received £780 17s. 9d. for them on 30 June 1868.

HENRY HOBDAY, born at Chartham, 18-2-1838, third and youngest son of Daniel and Sarah Elizabeth [1841 & 51 censuses] He worked at Chartham mill from 1848; wages 1s per week. There was a serious fire there in 1850. Daniel set out for Somerset where he found employment and sent for Henry to become an apprentice, but the plan was abandoned and both men were re-employed at Chartham. Around 1855 Henry spent a short time at Buckland Mill, Dover, but was back at Chartham by 1857. By 1859 he moved to McMurray's Mill, Wandsworth. He married Hepzibah, daughter of Isaac Tovey, on 3 Sep 1859, at All Saints, Maidstone. In 1861 he was living at Wellington Rd, Orpington, as paper maker 1856 to Buckland from 1871; then to St Paul's Cray; to Snodland 1865; to Buckland Mill, Dover in 1879 (until 1906); died 13 May 1921. A member of the Independent (Congregational) church while he was in Snodland. In 1860 a son John was born at East Malling, where Henry was Salle Foreman and later General Foreman for George Busbridge. In 1862 a daughter was born at St Mary Cray (William Joynson); in 1864 a son at St Paul's Cray (William Nash).

In 1865 Henry moved to Snodland to become Manager and later General Manager. On 2 August 1868 Hepzibah was admitted to the congregation of the Independent Church as was Henry on 4 October following. In 1875 he was receiving a salary of £300 p.a. with a rent-free house and heating. This was part of May Villas near the mill, with access from the corner of May Street and East Street. Eustace Hook gave him a gold watch on a heavy gold chain in 1878, inscribed "A token of esteem and respect". Henry could not get on with Colonel Holland, the new manager, and left in 1879.

He then went into partnership with Charles Ashdown at Buckland Mill, Dover, which was sold to Wiggins and Teape in 1890. Henry Hobday remained as manager. Wiggins and Teape bought Glory Mill, Wooburn Green, for £14,000 in 1894 and Henry Hobday was instructed to find what trade he could for it. Glory Mill burned down in 1900 and was rebuilt by John Hobday, son of Henry. Henry Hobday

retired from Buckland Mill in 1906, and was succeeded by his son Lewis. He was elected to Dover Town Council in 1904 and later became an Alderman and JP. He was a steady chapel goer. Henry died in 1921, aged 83, and is buried at Buckland churchyard

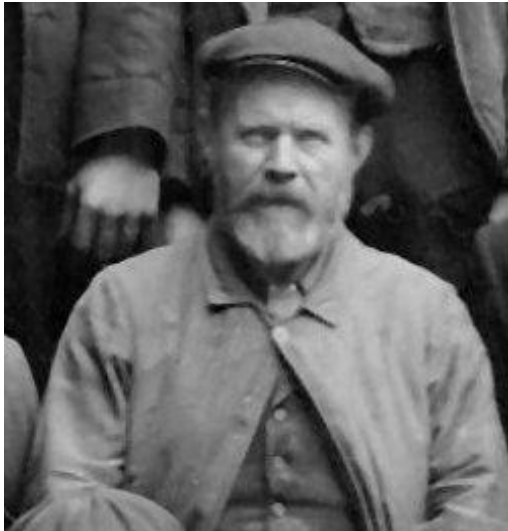

GEORGE RANDELL was killed in an accident at the paper mill on 14 May 1887 and was bur. at AS on 21 May; This hand-written tribute was probably written by the New Jerusalem minister, Arthur Faraday, and is in a scrap-book in the church archive:

'One of our friends here who entered the Spiritual world on Saturday May 14th deserves a word of respectful and affectionate memoir: Mr George Randell, who met his death while on duty at the paper

mill. He had passed the threescore years of his earthly life and has been for over 50 years a member of the New Church. Among those who formed the earliest Salisbury Society he enjoyed the ministries of the Revs. Goyder and Dyke, of whom he always spoke in loving remembrance, and when brought to Snodland by the late Mr S. Hook more than 30 years ago he continued in the Church here. His quiet, kind, genial nature with mind ever active on the true teachings of the Word gained for him the respect and esteem of all who met him and knew him. He was most truly an example of the Church in life and when his remains were borne to their resting place in the Churchyard, they were followed by the largest concourse of people many had ever seen together in Snodland on such an occasion, while the whole place offered its testimony of sympathy and kind feeling. Many beautiful wreaths of flowers were sent, among them being from Veles: The Misses Hook; Ivymeath: Colonel and Mrs Holland, Mr Gibson, Mr Bales, the Choir, the chief masters and men at the mill there, and others, with the many flowers made the grave look as it should look, the reverse of gloom and sorrow, despite the rain which fell during the internment. At the memorial service on the following Sunday evening a crowded congregation testified their feelings, and recitation [of] 'Pope's Ode' at the close of the service, and Chopin's 'Funeral march' with the congregation seated concluded a testimony to a New Churchman of the humblest lass and one which nothing but goodness and truth in life could gain.'

[*Kent Messenger*, 16 May]. On Monday afternoon last, Mr. T. Buss, coroner for the district, held an inquest at the Queen's Head Hotel, under the foremanship of Mr. George Corney, touching the death of Mr. George Randall, aged 71 years, who met with his death on the previous Saturday, in the Snodland Paper Works.—It appeared from the evidence produced that deceased had been in the employ of the firm for upwards of 22 years, and recently did odd jobs on the works. On Saturday morning he was instructed to tighten a belt on the machinery, which had recently been put on, and which had stretched so much that it was necessary to have it tightened. There was a bearer or "bat" used in removing the belts from the fast pulleys, but instead of making use of this, it is supposed that he ventured to remove it with his hands, and consequently was taken over with the belt, which caused his death. The machinery was at once stopped, and deceased was removed to the machine-room pending the arrival of Dr. J. H. Smith, who pronounced life to be extinct. The medical gentleman afterwards made a post-mortem examination, and found that deceased's neck was broken, the spinal chord severed, and the wind-pipe injured.—The jury returned a verdict of "Accidental death," and exonerated the firm from all blame in the matter.

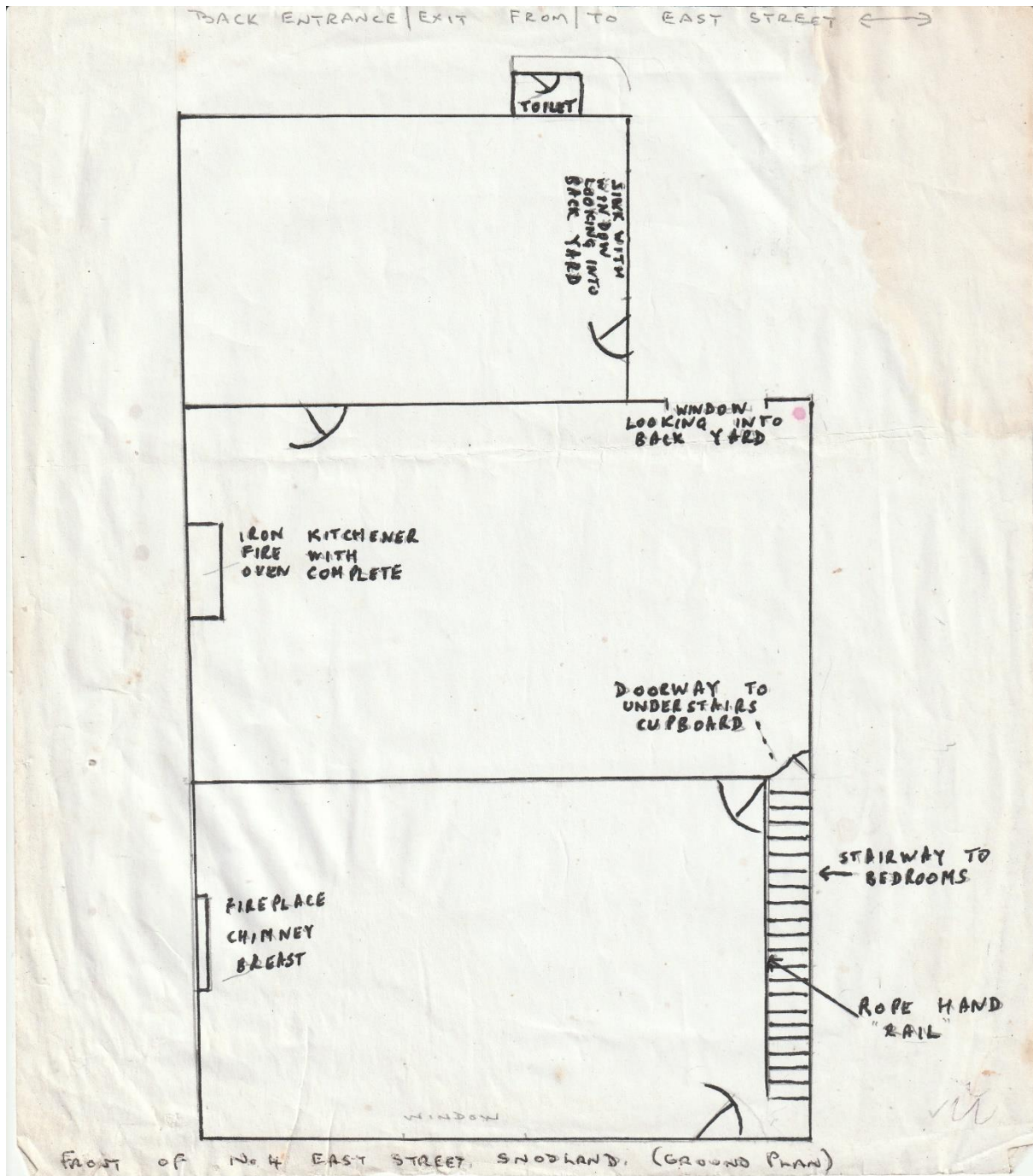

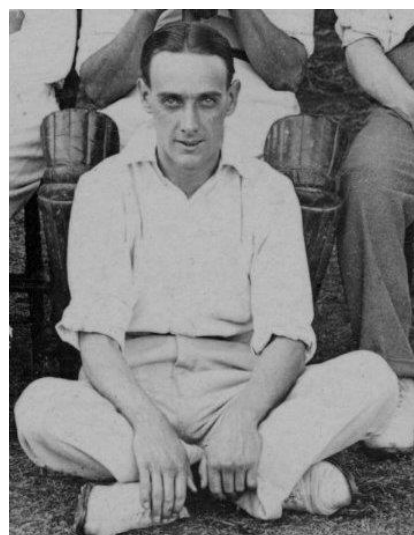
