The area, in 1841, was 1,516 acres, about 70 of which are common, and the population 620. In 1842 the Property Tax assessment was £2,380. The church, dedicated to All Saints, is an ancient and spacious structure, with 12 stained glass windows, the eastern of which contains full length portraits of the martyrs, Cranmer, Ridley, Latimer, and Ann Askew. Paddlesworth, 1 mile west, is extra parochial, and has only 1 house and 9 persons.

[Description] ... The living is a rectory, yearly value from tithe rent charge, £406, with residence and 19 acres of glebe, ... held since 1874 by the Rev. John George Bingley M.A. of Brasenose College, Oxford, and surrogate. The Swedenborgian church, now almost completed, is a cruciform structure in the Early English style, consisting of chancel, nave, organ chamber, vestry and a square tower, with stair turret 56 feet high, at the north-west corner; it is built of Kentish rag with Bath stone dressings and is fitted throughout in pitch pine, with sittings for 300 persons: the cost, amounting to over £2,000 has been entirely defrayed by the Misses Hook and Col. Holland, as a memorial to their parents and brother. There are Congregational and Primitive Methodist Chapels. A large clock tower with three illuminated dials has been erected to the memory of Mr Charles Townsend Hook. The village is lighted with gas, the free gift of the Misses Hook. A working men's institute was erected in 1877 by W. Lee esq. and contains reading and billiard rooms, library of 200 volumes and a concert hall. The Temperance Hall was erected by the Misses Hook in 1882. ... Here is a paper mill, the property of Messrs Hook, employing about 350 persons and manufacturing weekly more than 90 tons of paper. ... Holborough Court, the seat of Major Roberts J.P. is a spacious brick building, near the Medway, commanding a fine view of the range of chalk hills on the opposite bank of the river. William Henry Poynder esq. is lord of the manor. The principal landowners are Major Roberts J.P., Thomas Day and Thomas Stephens esqrs. ... The chief crops are wheat, oats, barley and hops. The area is 1,876 acres, of which about 70 are common land; rateable value, £9,000; the population in 1871 was 1,844 and 2,826 in 1881.

Snodland is a village and a parish ... with a station on the North Kent line of the South Eastern and Chatham Railway, ... in the Mid-division of the county, lathe of Aylesford, Larkfield hundred, Malling petty sessional division and union, Maidstone county court district, Cobham rural deanery, and Rochester archdeaconry and diocese. The village is lighted with gas from works the property of the Mid-Kent Gas Light & Coke Co., and supplied with water from the works of the Mid Kent Water Co. at Halling. ... The living is a rectory, net yearly value £294, with residence, and 19 acres of glebe and Ferry house, in the gift of the Bishop of Rochester, and held since 1909 by the Rev. Charles de Rocfort Wall M.A. of St Catherine's College, Cambridge.

The Mission Church at HOLBOROUGH is a structure of corrugated iron, and will seat 100 persons. The New Jerusalem (Swedenborgian) church, consecrated June 27th, 1882, and erected at a cost amounting to over £5,000, has sittings for 300 persons. There is a Congregational chapel, erected in 1822, with sittings for 400 persons, and Baptist and Primitive Methodist chapels. A cemetery of 4 acres was formed in 1895, at a cost of £2,000; it contains a mortuary chapel, and is under the control of the Parish Council. A large clock tower with three illuminated dials has been added to the building of the British school as a memorial to the late Mr. Charles Townsend Hook. A Working Men's Institute was erected in 1877 by W. Lee esq. and contains reading and billiard rooms, library of 600 volumes and a concert hall. The Temperance Hall and Coffee Tavern was built in 1882 by the Misses Hook. The Public Baths, erected in 1900, also at the expense of the Misses Hook, have been transferred to the Parish Council. In the neighbourhood are extensive lime and cement works and a paper mill ... [Notes on the charities follow.] ... I Waghorn road are three Almshouses, erected in 1893, by Mis M. M. Hook, and four others, added in 1903, were erected by the Misses Hook. There is a Fire Brigade. Holborough Court, the property and residence of William Lee Henry Roberts esq. J.P. was rebuilt in 1884. The principal landowners are W. L. H. Roberts esq., Francis Henry Cripps-Day esq., the Hon. Ralph Pelham Nevill, of Birling manor, Miss Hook and Col. Everard T. Luck, of The Hermitage, West Malling ... In 1897 about 100 acres of the parish of Birling were annexed to Snodland. ... the population in 1911 was 4,184 in the civil parish and 3,072 in the ecclesiastical parish.

Snodland is a parish situated amid an undulating country, on the western bank of the Medway, with a station on the North Kent line of the Southern railway, and is 6½ miles south-west from Rochester and 8 north-west from Maidstone, in the Sevenoaks division of the county, lathe of Aylesford, hundred of Larkfield, petty sessional division and rural district of Malling, county court district of Maidstone, rural deanery of Cobham and archdeaconry and diocese of Rochester. Gas and electricity are available. Water is supplied from the works of the Mid-Kent Water Co. The church of All Saints, standing close upon the Medway, is of Kentish rag and flint, intermixed with fragments of Roman bricks and tiles; the building is mainly Early English of the 13th and 14th centuries, but with some traces of the Perpendicular style, and has a tower, restored about 1894, and containing a clock and six bells: as a war memorial the five bells were re-hung and a sixth added, with an inscription in memory of Snodland men who fell in the Great War, 1914-18; also a brass tablet was erected in the nave of the church bearing the 98 names of the fallen: there are monuments to the Palmer, Tilghman and Waghorn families, memorial windows to Archdeacon Carey and others, and a few brasses. The interior was restored in 1873 and partially renovated in 1892, and a new vestry was added in 1905: the church affords 450 sittings. The register dates from the year 1559. The living is a rectory, net yearly value £398, with residence, standing in 18 acres of glebe, in the gift of the Bishop of Rochester, and held since 1930 by the Rev. Cecil Harry Buckingham L.Th. of Durham University. The New Jerusalem (Swedenborgian) church, in Waghorn road [*recte* High Street], consecrated in 1882, has sittings for 100 persons. There is a Congregational chapel, erected in 1822, with sittings

for 400 persons, and Baptist and Methodist chapels. A cemetery of 4 acres was formed in 1895 it contains a mortuary chapel, and is under the control of the Parish Council. A cenotaph, designed from the one in Whitehall, was erected in the cemetery in 1920. A large clock tower with three illuminated dials was added to the buildings, formerly the British school, as a memorial to Mr. Charles Townsend Hook. A Woking Men's Institute was erected in 1877 by W. Lee esq. and contains reading and billiard rooms, library of 600 volumes and a concert hall. The Temperance Hall and Coffee Tavern was built in 1882 by the Misses Hook. The Public Baths, erected in 1900, also at the expense of the Misses Hook, were subsequently transferred to the Parish Council. In the neighbourhood are lime and cement works and a paper mill. May's charity, left in 1800 by John May of Holborough, consists of certain moneys in the hands of the Charity Commissioners, for the joint benefit of the parishes of Snodland, Halling and Birling, the interest of which is to be expended on the National schools; it also includes a charge of £20 yearly on land in Holborough, to be expended in providing great coats for the aged poor of the above three parishes: the Godden charity, derived from the rent of 20 acres of land at Ivy Church, left in 1661 [*recte* 1662] by Edward Godden, is applied in apprenticing children of the parish. In Waghorn road are three almshouses erected in 1893 by Miss M. M. Hook, and four others, added in 1903, were erected by the Misses Hook. There is a Fire Brigade. The principal landowners are the Associated Portland Cement Manufacturers Ltd. The soil is gravelly; subsoil clay. The chief crops are wheat, oats & barley. The area in 1,955 acres, 3 of inland and 12 of tidal water and 18 of foreshore; in 1897 about 100 acres of the parish of Birling were annexed to Snodland; there are in the parish about 1,964 acres of common land and 4 of water; the population of the civil parish in 1931 was 4,168, and of the ecclesiastical parish, 2,906.

PADDLESWORTH is a hamlet, 1 mile west; it was formerly a parish.

POMPHERY and Dode Chapel are places of interest in the immediate neighbourhood. The chapel was restored in 1906 by the late George Matthews Arnold esq.
